TOLA Fellowship program Summary:

The Organizing and Leadership Academy, TOLA, is a one-of-a-kind, rigorous, non-ideological, "hands-on" training program for individuals interested and motivated to pursue a career in Community organizing. TOLA Fellows spend sixteen weeks in a "real-life" organizing boot camp. During this intensive fellowship, TOLA Fellows work on community organizing projects and campaigns, participate in classroom instruction, are required to do significant reading and reflective writing, and are challenged weekly by engaging guests who have included Marshall Ganz, Larry Tramutola, Fred Ross Jr., Dolores Huerta, and other experienced and effective organizers and leaders throughout California.

Stipend:

TOLA provides a living stiped to all Fellows during the duration of the program of \$10,000 (\$2,500 per month) for the duration of the fellowship.

About the Award

What: \$2,500 scholarship

Who can apply: UG majors in the social sciences (Anthropology, Economics, Education, Environmental Studies, Latin American & Latino Studies, Legal Studies, Politics, Psychology, and Sociology)

How to apply: Submit a resume and short essay (2-3 pages maximum) to your UG Advisor about your passion for social issues and commitment to public service.

The KHOP Summer Session is designed to equip high potential undergraduate students from underrepresented communities with the skills necessary to excel in the law school admissions process, while also introducing students to current law students, lawyers and faculty members at UC Davis School of Law. KHOP Summer Session also helps students improve their critical analysis and writing skills through iterative writing assignments and presentations on topics designed by students. The no-cost program consists of a series of full-day Saturday presentations and workshops, and a Friday visit to a trial or appellate courtroom, during the summer.
