





From June 3 to July 31, 2019, Fellows will work full-time at the ABF's office in Chicago and receive a stipend of \$3,600. Each Fellow will be assigned to work on a specific research project with an

experienced ABF scholar, participate in various in-house seminars, and go on field visits to law firms, social justice nonprofits, and criminal courtrooms. They will also have the opportunity to sit in on graduate level classes and meet with admissions representatives from local law schools.

The LSAC Research Diversity Fellow will continue their fellowship after the summer and work as a part-time research assistant at the ABF for a full academic year.


